

## Dear Prospective Spansor

Sponsorship is all about achieving my target of raising at least £1 per mile pedalled for The Outward Bound Trust – about £45,000 – either directly through charitable donations made through <a href="https://www.justgiving.com/acrosscontinents">www.justgiving.com/acrosscontinents</a>, or indirectly by supporting me on the road. Whilst many potential sponsors may wish to opt for the relative simplicity of an off-the-shelf package, others may prefer a more bespoke arrangement.

Two off-the-shelf sponsorship packages are available – 'Spokes' and 'Chain-links'. Those donating £100 can opt to join the 'Chain-links' club and 'adopt' one of the 59 links in my bicycle chain. Donate £300 or more and you can opt to join the 'Spokes' club and 'adopt' one of 32 spokes in a wheel. More details are shown overleaf.

## 'Spokes' and 'Chain-links'

Those who opt to join the 'Spokes' club will have their name shown on a graphical representation of the wheel, in similar style to other artwork on the website, which will be given prominence on the site and be featured widely in promotional and presentation material. Similarly, those who opt to join the 'Chain-links' club will have their name shown on a graphical representation of the bicycle chain.
